The goal of National Influenza Vaccination Week is to provide an opportunity for local communities to share information on the importance of annual influenza immunization. The Federal Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has reported that the single best way to protect yourself and your loved ones against the flu is to get vaccinated each year. The CDC reports that every year in the United States on average more than 200,000 individuals are hospitalized and about 36,000 people die from complications due to the flu. Complications from influenza can include bacterial pneumonia, dehydration and worsening of chronic medical conditions such as congestive heart failure, asthma or diabetes.
