Welcome to Bridgewater Township! I am sure that you will find this community will meet your every expectation. The Township covers 33 square miles and is home to 44,000 residents. We are located in the center of Somerset County, bordering 11 other municipalities. Bridgewater boasts a variety of parks, recreation and shopping opportunities, excellent schools, a minor league ballpark and employment options at national and international pharmaceutical and biotechnology firms.

The Township Offices are located at 100 Commons way near Bridgewater-Raritan high School. The Police Department, Municipal Court, and our Kidstreet playground are at the same location. Shade Tree Board

Establishes the standards for landscape environment, location, type, size of trees, and the development of landscaped buffer areas within the Township.

Sustainability

A subcommittee to the Environmental Commission that supports the Sustainable Jersey initiatives.

Youth Services Commission Bridgewater-Raritan Alliance for the Prevention of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Implements various grant funded programs related to youth issues and substance abuse prevention for all ages.

5) Registrants who are submitting this form by mail and are registering to vote for the first time: If you do not have any of the information required by section 5, or the information you provide cannot be verified, you will be asked to provide a COPY of a current and valid photo ID, or a document with your name and current address on it to avoid having to provide identification at the polling place.

Note: ID Numbers are Confidential and will not be released by any governmental agency. Any person who uses such numbers illegally shall be subject to criminal penalties.

- 6) If you are homeless, you may complete section 6 by providing a contact point or the location where you spend most of your time.
- 10) You may declare a political affiliation or you may declare to be unaffiliated, regardless of any prior party affiliation. Completing section 10 is OPTIONAL and will not affect the acceptance of your voter registration application.

New Jersey Voter Registration Information

You can register to vote if:

- You are a United States citizen
- You will be 18 years of age by the next election
- You will be a resident of the State and county 30 days before the election
- You are **NOT** currently serving a sentence, probation or parole because of a felony conviction

Registration Deadline: 21 days before an election

Your County Commissioner of Registration will notify you if your application is accepted.

If it is not accepted, you will be notified on how to complete and/or correct the application.
