Dear Constituent,

The Division of Taxation has mailed applications for the 2016 Property Tax Reimbursement (Senior Freeze) Program to senior citizens and disabled residents who may be eligible. **The deadline for filing 2016 applications has been extended to October 18, 2017.**

This very successful program is now in its nineteenth year. The relief is available to homeowners 65-years and older who have low or moderate incomes, or to disabled residents who receive federal Social Security payments. Residents applying for the 2016 reimbursement must have a total income that was \$87,007 or less for 2015 and 2016. These income limits apply for all applicants, regardless of marital/civil union status. All applicants must continue to meet all the income eligibility and residency requirements and must file an application each year to receive the reimbursement.
