Resolutions Council President Rose asked whether Council had any comments on the resolutions listed below.

AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A POLICE SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR THREE CLASS III OFFICERS FOR SCHOOL SAFETY WITH BRIDGEWATER RARITAN BOARD OF EDUCATION ("BOARD") WITH ALL COSTS OF THE THREE CLASS III OFFICERS TO BE PAID BY THE BOARD

Councilman Norgalis requested additional language be added to the resolution under the fifth paragraph to read:

WHEREAS, the Board shall reimburse the Township for all costs associated with the hiring of three additional Class III Officers, including start up equipment costs and recurring charges as well as any cost of litigation, including reasonable attorney fees and any damages resulting from any claims against the Class III Officers arising from the services provided to the Bridgewater school system pursuant to this Agreement.

Mr. Naples stated he would pass this information regarding insurance coverage to the Board of Education and get back to Council on Monday.

APPROVAL TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION AND EXECUTE A GRANT CONTRACT WITH THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION UNDER THEIR 2019 BIKEWAYS PROGRAM FOR THE CAMP CROMWELL BIKE PATH IN THE AMOUNT OF \$279,565

Councilman Moench commented he is not opposed to submitting a grant especially with no matching funds but he does not understand the Camp Cromwell plan as a whole and the overall use of the bikeway.

Mr. Naples stated the presentation on Monday will provide Council with maps and an overview on this project.

Council had no questions regarding the foregoing resolution.

AUTHORIZING AWARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING/SURVEYING SERVICES CONTRACT FOR THE I-287 EMERGENCY VEHICLE ACCESS FROM COUNTRY CLUB ROAD ONTO I-78 RAMP TO THE REYNOLDS GROUP, INC., (575 ROUTE 28, SUITE 110, RARITAN, NJ 08869) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$59,200.00 FUNDED THROUGH THE 2012 CAPITAL BOND

Councilman Norgalis raised some concern with this resolution as to whether Bridgewater could spend Bridgewater capital money in the amount of \$59,200 in Bedminster.

Mr. Savo recommended the bond counsel be consulted to be sure these expenses can be funded through capital monies.

Mr. Naples stated he will reach out to the bond counsel for clarification. He noted before the meeting the Township reached out to Bedminster who approves the emergency ramp providing access to be constructed in their town.

Councilman Norgalis questioned Mr. Naples stating since this is at the bequest of Green Knoll Fire District 3 who is a taxing agency are they willing to share any of the funding being the ramps are being constructed for them to have access to I-287?

Councilman Moench supports the concept of the access but wants to ensure we are not footing the bill from the Fire District. Councilman Moench asked Mr. Naples to have Natasha Turchan, CFO prepare an update report on the bonds in surplus.

Councilman Norgalis requested this item be removed from the agenda for Monday to gain more finite answers from the Fire District and what the Federal Highway position will be. Council was in consensus to remove this item from the October 1, 2018 agenda.
