Discussion CONSOLIDATION OF HEALTH OFFICER SERVICES In light of Health Officer Peter Leung's retirement in April, Councilmen Moench and Norgalis offered that they wanted to discuss whether Administration has considered consolidating the Township's Heath Department to Somerset County as a shared service option. Council President Moench asked Township Administrator Naples whether there has been a review on this matter.

Mr. Naples offered he has not met with the Somerset County representatives but has researched other municipalities such as Franklin and others that utilize the Somerset County Health Services. Mr. Naples stated these services are not free as it would entail a transfer of services and offered that at this time, Administration does not believe it would be a cost effective consideration. He added the Township offers quality health services to residents which they would like to keep in house.

Council President Moench stated someone should meet with Somerset County representatives to determine which services they provide in comparison to our current standards and what dollar amount would work in order to facilitate. This way there would be actual numbers which would remove the guesswork.

Mr. Naples offered to meet and provide the number to Council for equal or better services than what we currently provide.

Councilman Norgalis said he reached out to the Mayor last September/October and has not heard back on this matter. Councilman Pedroso expressed concern as he would like the administration to make more effort in addressing Council's questions more expeditiously.

PublicOn motion of Councilman Norgalis, seconded by Councilman Pedroso, the
meeting was opened to the public.

Members of the public wishing to address the Council on any matter will be allowed two minutes to speak, unless there are unusual circumstances.

No one wished to be heard.

PublicORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS ANDHearing &TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK FOR THE 2019 CALENDAR YEAR (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-Final Action45.14)Ordinances

Mr. Naples stated this is something we do every year. It is not an expenditure but rather an Ordinance that allows us to exceed the cap in the event that it is necessary. This ordinance is consistent with similar ones over the years. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 126 (LAND USE), ARTICLE XLV (SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS GOVERNING CERTAIN USES), SECTION 126-335 ENTITLED RENEWABLE ENERGY FACILITIES OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRIDGEWATER SO AS TO PERMIT RENEWABLE ENERGY FACILITIES ON DETACHED RESIDENTIAL GARAGES

Council President Moench stated Resident Curtis Kraut appeared before the governing body a few weeks ago and explained the way our ordinance was written would disallow him from putting up solar facilities on his detached garage. This Ordinance will clarify the Council's intent.

Councilman Norgalis offered during discussion with Township Planner Scarlett Doyle that the ordinance may be too broad in describing what is considered a garage. It was agreed that Attorney Savo would discuss this issue with Planner Doyle.

Introduction AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRIDGEWATER AMENDING SECTION 126of Ordinance 326 PROVIDING FOR A NEW SECTION H REGULATING APPROVED LOT COVERAGE, LOT AREA COVERAGE, IMPERVIOUS LOT AREA COVERAGE, LOT WIDTH AND FLOOR AREA RATIO FOR LOTS THAT ARE SUBDIVIDED OR ACQUIRED BY GIFT OR PURCHASE BY A PUBLIC ENTITY FOR PERMANENT OPEN SPACE

Mr. Savo reported this ordinance was presented at the County's request and will promote the acquisition of Open Space. He will provide a list of properties for the regular Council session on Monday.

Resolutions AUTHORIZING BUDGET TRANSFERS FOR APPROPRIATION RESERVE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$382,200.00

Ms. Turchan explained transfers can only be done within the first three months of the beginning of each year and the last two months at the end of each year statutorily. This transfer will pay the obligated bills while we are on the temporary budget.
