- Dusk to Dawn
- On Rural and Suburban Roads
- Fall Mating Season (October through December)

Deer are everywhere!

- There are more than 15,000 deer–vehicle crashes in New Jersey each year.
- A deer crash can happen anytime but half occur from October through December, and three quarters happen from dusk to dawn.
- Deer crashes can occur almost anywhere outside of dense urban areas.
- Many deer crashes occur on two-lane roads with no median.
- Every year, deer crashes in New Jersey cause millions of dollars in vehicle damage, injuries, and even deaths.

Reduce your risk!

- Slow down If you see one deer, more may follow.
- Don't swerve If a crash is unavoidable, break firmly and stay in your lane.
- Keep headlights clean and aligned Use high beams when possible.
- Always buckle up It could save your life.
