Discussion

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 170 ENTITLED SANITATION" TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION "R" TO SECTION 170-5 ENTITLED "NUISANCES SPECIFIED

Council President Moench stated this is a potential Ordinance that came about because there is at least one incidence of a resident whose next door neighbor has giant flood lights on their property, causing a big nuisance to the neighborhood. He added our current Ordinance doesn't quite address excessive lighting. For that reason, the Township Attorney has drafted potential language in order to provide code enforcement with some ability to address matters such as these. After considerable discussion, Council agreed to send this Ordinance to the code department for feedback on whether or not the language contained in the proposed Ordinance is clearly and fairly defined.

Public Comment

On motion of Councilman Kurdyla, seconded by Councilman Norgalis, the meeting was opened to the public.

Members of the public wishing to address the Council on any matter will be allowed two minutes to speak, unless there are unusual circumstances.

<u>Bob Papp</u>, 1379 Coriell <u>Drive in Basking Ridge</u> was present. He stated he has been a resident for 40-years, is a trustee of Washington Camp premises and a member of the friends of Bridgewater history. He spoke in favor of the Ordinance that is on tonight's agenda concerning historic preservation for the purposes of creating the office of township historian and a local history advisory committee.

Jane Gandolfe, 2000 Washington Valley Road was present. She stated she is a lifelong resident of Bridgewater adding her family has lived here for over 200-years. She spoke concerning the Ordinance that is on tonight's agenda concerning historic preservation. She expressed her disappointment that it was tabled from the last meeting and asked that this matter be addressed timely and favorably.

<u>Howard Stamato, 10 Northern Drive</u> was present. Spoke in favor of the Ordinance that is on tonight's agenda concerning historic preservation and asked for a favorable vote.

<u>Cathy Franco</u>, 766 Weemac Road in <u>Bridgewater</u> was present. She spoke in favor of the historic ordinance that is on tonight's agenda. Regarding the Ordinance concerning the elimination of a 25-mile residency requirement for the police chief, Ms. Franco stated she continues to have concerns noting the chief of police should be able to respond to an emergency within a reasonable amount of time and should therefore live within the prescribed 25-mile radius.

<u>Michael Kirsh, 25 Danberry Lane</u> was present. He stated he is a council memberelect and wanted to make a scheduling advisory. The Bridgewater United Methodist Church will be hosting a thanksgiving service on Wednesday evening which is a great way for the community to celebrate together.
