Expanded Re-Opening of Government Buildings & Services

During the COVID-19 Pandemic

Over the past few weeks, Bridgewater Township has gradually taken steps to welcome our residents back into our municipal building.

We are pleased to announce that, starting this coming Monday, June 15th, we will welcome the public to access the municipal building in order to complete necessary business between the hours of 9:00AM and 5:00PM.

We're excited to welcome our residents back into the building, with the following restrictions:

Residents must wear a protective mask to enter the building.

If you are sick, test positive for COVID-19, or have been exposed to somebody with COVID-19, please do not enter the building at this time.

If you have been sick, before entering the building, please ensure that:

- 1) You have had no fever for 72 hours, without fever-reducing medication, AND
- 2) Your other symptoms (e.g. cough) have improved, AND
- 3) It has been at least 10 days since you first experienced symptoms.

If you tested positive for COVID-19 but did not have any symptoms, please wait at least 10 days after your test before entering the building.

If you have been exposed to someone who is sick or tested positive for COVID-19, please wait at least 14 days after your exposure before entering the building.

Please note that the DPW facility which Bridgewater shares with Somerset County on Chimney Rock Road <u>will not</u> open to the public, as Somerset County has not yet directed the re-opening of their facilities.

While residents are welcome back inside the building to complete necessary business, if your business can be completed by phone, e-mail, fax or other remote means, we encourage you to take advantage of those options in order to minimize unnecessary contact with others.
