Mayor's Reports

Michael Pappas, Township Administrator reported for Mayor Moench:

- Council had designated a property on North Bridge Street as the Hancock preserve. Public Works created and posted a sign on the property to indicate that was the name of the property. Administrator Pappas expressed appreciation to resident Roberta Heller who helped advocate for that very worthwhile project.
- The road program has seen great success this year. Sections 1,2,3,5 and 6 are complete.
- We were able to accomplish some additional road work by creating Section 7 which was not geographically specific to one part of the community but was as a result of savings and lower costs realized through the bidding process.
- All the planned road work for 2021 is complete except for some streets on Section 4.
- Administrator Pappas thanked the Public Works department, Recreation department and Office of Constituent Relations and a number of volunteers for their efforts with the Christmas Tree Lighting and the Menorah lighting events.
- Thanked the Council for its partnership and willingness to spend a lot of time to work with and support the administration.

Presentation BRIDGEWATER PARKS

Township Administrator Pappas stated the Council had asked for a report about the condition of our parks. In August, some members of the administration visited every single municipal park in Bridgewater township and assessed conditions in an initial manner. Members of the administration provided a report

of the conditions of the parks which included 18-parks in total, 2turf fields, 16 playgrounds, 9 basketball courts, 8 tennis courts, frisbee golf course, 1 cricket pitch, 1 sand volley ball court, 15 baseball/softball fields, 3 football fields and 9 pavilions.

What is the cost for the change from Blue Cross Blue Shield to the State health Benefit plan? Will this be a cost savings considering most health insurances have increased approximately 15%? What is the average number of hours required to be considered eligible for benefits and how does this affect employees' verses elected official's eligibility? What is the contribution for spouse/family etc. and is it in line with what the general public contributes for this type of coverage for their families? What are the anticipated overall savings in switching and is the new plan considered a self-funded health insurance plan?

With regard to the park's presentation, Ms. Franco appreciated the information provided tonight and agreed with Councilman Pedroso and other members of the Council who supported soliciting the public at large for their opinion on how to move forward and reaching out to them to participate whether through contributions of time or money.

Township Administrator Pappas explained we are seeing a very significant increase in our health premiums which is approximately a 29% increase/ \$2M to our budget for the year. We are interested in pursuing the State health benefit plan which will be less costly although we do not have a definitive number yet. We are also attempting, with our risk manager, to make some modifications that would lessen that 29%. This resolution will allow us to continue our current insurance through 3/31/2022.

On the motion of Councilman Ring, seconded by Councilman Kirsh, the meeting reconvened to open session at approximately 10:46 p.m. and adjourned immediately thereafter.
