To control stormwater from new development and redevelopment projects throughout the Township of Bridgewater (including projects we operate) we will do the following:

The Township is already ensuring that all new residential development and redevelopment projects that are subject to the Residential Site Improvement Standards for stormwater management (including the NJDEP Stormwater Management rules, N.J.A.C. 7:8, referenced in those standards) are in compliance with those standards. Our planning and zoning boards ensure such compliance before issuing a preliminary or final subdivision or site plan approvals under the Municipal Land Use Law.

The Township of Bridgewater has not constructed any new development or redevelopment projects on Municipal property. If we decide to construct such a project before our municipal stormwater control ordinance takes effect, we will ensure adequate long-term operation and maintenance of BMPs for that project by requiring a project maintenance plan similar to the maintenance plan described in our draft of that ordinance, and by requiring and funding the implementation of that plan. We will also require any storm drain inlets that we install to comply with the design standard in Attachment C of our permit. Once that ordinance takes effect, we will ensure such operation and maintenance for any new development or redevelopment projects on our property by complying with the maintenance requirements in that ordinance. In addition, any storm drain inlets we install for such projects will comply with that ordinance's standard for such inlets.

Our planning board and municipal attorney will review the Sample Municipal Stormwater Management Plan and Model Stormwater Control Ordinance in the NJ Stormwater BMP Manual, and will draft a municipal stormwater management plan and municipal stormwater control ordinance similar to that sample and model. We will also coordinate with county planning agency staff to discuss the draft plan and ordinance. The plan and ordinance will be adopted by our planning board and Governing Body, respectively, by the deadlines specified in the permit, and will be submitted to the county planning agency for approval.

Once approved, the ordinance, which will be administered by our planning and zoning boards, municipal engineer and code enforcement officer, will control stormwater from non-residential development and redevelopment projects. Where it is necessary to implement the municipal stormwater management plan, the approved ordinance will also control aspects of residential development and redevelopment projects that are not subject to the Residential Site Improvement Standards.

The Township seeks to label structures over the first five (5) years of the permit. Approximately 2,500 labels are proposed for the 2005 calendar year. The Township will coordinate with local civic organizations on the labeling program.

Labeling shall be done with plastic labels by the publicworks department and/or local civic organizations.

The Township of Bridgewater will retain Maser Consulting P.A. to map out the location of the end of all outfall pipes operated by the Township. Maser Consulting P.A. will identify, locate, map and investigate (see Illicit Connection Elimination Program and Outfall Pipe Stream Scouring Remediation Program) each outfall pipe that is located.

The Township of Bridgewater has contracted with Maser Consulting P.A. to conduct an initial physical inspection of all of our outfall pipes during the mapping process. The Township will use the DEP Illicit Connection Inspection Report Form to conduct these inspections, and each of these forms will be kept with our SPPP records. Outfall pipes that are found to have a dry weather flow or evidence of an intermittent non-stormwater flow will be rechecked again to locate the illicit connection. If we are able to locate the illicit connection (and the connection is within the Township of Bridgewater) we will cite the responsible party for being in violation of our Illicit Connection Ordinance(once adopted), and we will have the connection eliminated immediately. If, after the appropriate amount of investigation, we are unable to locate the source of the illicit connection, we will submit the Closeout Investigation Form with our Annual Inspection and Recertification. If an illicit connection is found to originate from another public entity, the Township will report the illicit connection to the Department.

The Township of Bridgewater has evaluated all of its streets to determine which areas will need to be swept. 211 miles of roadway are maintained by the Township. Of this, 25% (55 miles) are in non-residential areas with speed limits 35 mph or less. These areas have been grouped together into five separate groups, and each group will be assigned a different schedule. A copy of the street groupings and sweeping forms are attached.

The Township of Bridgewater intends on maintaining its existing street sweeping program for all other streets (that are not included in the permit), which includes sweeping of all streets at least two times per year.

Road Erosion Control Maintenance

The Township of Bridgewater will use the Public Works Department to monitor all their roads and streets for erosion problems during normal patrols. All identified road erosion problems will be reported to John Langel, the Public Works Superintendent. During SPPP Team meetings, identified areas of erosion will be discussed and repairs prioritized. Public Works Department personnel will then be assigned to the areas of concern, and the areas identified to have road erosion problems will be repaired in accordance with the Standards for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control in New Jersey. All maintenance personnel will maintain an inspection log, and John Langel will maintain a list of all repairs and dates completed. The status of the Road Erosion Control Maintenance Program will be included in the Annual Report and Recertification.

Starting in 2005, cleaning of catch basins will be included in this program. All catch basins will be cleaned once per year. If, at the time of inspection, no sediment, trash or debris are observed in the catch basin, then that catch basin will not be cleaned. At the time of cleaning, the catch basin will also be inspected for proper function. Maintenance will be scheduled for those catch basins that are in disrepair. Maintenance is typically performed during the summer months. The annual catch basin cleaning program will be on-going and will continue during the permit period.
