

**MINUTES OF THE BRIDGEWATER TOWNSHIP COUNCIL  
FEBRUARY 15, 2024 COUNCIL CHAMBERS**

The Township Council of the Township of Bridgewater, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, convened in a regular session on Thursday, February 15, 2024, at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers in the Municipal Complex, Bridgewater, New Jersey 08807 & via Live Online Broadcast.

Council President Ring read the following announcement:

Councilman Norgalis led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Minutes**

**FEBRUARY 1, 2024 - REGULAR SESSION**

On motion of Councilman Kirsh, seconded by Councilman Norgalis, the February 1, 2024, regular session minutes were moved for approval and passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

**FEBRUARY 1, 2024 - CLOSED SESSIONS**

The February 1, 2024, closed session minutes were passed around for Council approval & signature.

**Council Reports**

Councilman Kirsh:

- Attended the New Jersey Jewish Public Officials Caucus on February 6<sup>th</sup>. This event was arranged by the New Jersey Jewish Business Alliance and held at Rutgers University where they discussed the rise of anti-Semitism.

It was attended by seven members of the state legislature, two senators, five assembly members, several mayors, council members, and county commissioners. Councilman Kirsh stated that he was happy to stand up to hate, in all its forms.

- Attended the Planning Board's reorganization meeting. Maurizio Vescio was named to continue as Chairman, and Ashley Sikora as Vice Chair. The Zoning Board did not meet due to inclement weather.
- Attended the Chinese Lunar New Year Celebration at the Bridgewater Commons Mall on February 10, 2024. Councilman Kirsh expressed his appreciation to the organizers for a well-planned event.

Councilman Kurdyla:

- Congratulated Officer Alex Jaszyn on being sworn in to the Police Department.
- Congratulated Public Works on a job well done during the recent snow storm.
- The Fire District Elections will take place on Saturday, February 17, 2024. Councilman Kurdyla urged residents to participate and asked that they review and support the budgets. By doing so, they will be supporting the volunteers in the township who provide excellent service to our communities.

Councilman Norgalis (*verbatim*):

- The Lunar New Year is here, and this year it's all about the Dragon. It is one of 12 animals assigned from the Chinese Zodiac System. The holiday, also known as Chinese New Year and Spring Festival, is celebrated by Asian Communities throughout the world. It officially kicked off on Feb. 10 marking the beginning of countless celebrations worldwide.
- Valentine's Day was yesterday. Valentine's Day, also called Saint Valentine's Day or the Feast of Saint Valentine, is celebrated annually on February 14. It originated as a Christian feast day honoring a martyr named Valentine and through later folk traditions, it has also become a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance and love in many regions of the world. So, if you have a special Valentine in your life hold them close.
- February is the awareness month for heart health in the United States, with one day set aside as National Wear Red Day to raise awareness of

heart disease.

- Attended the monthly meeting of the Bridgewater Raritan Municipal Alliance for the Prevention of Alcoholism and Drug Use. That is a very long title with an extremely important mission. HELP YOUNG PEOPLE with education and awareness to not only avoid alcohol and drugs but also smoking and vaping. You have probably heard of MADD, which is Mothers Against Drunk Driving but you may not have heard about an equally important group called SADD. This stands for Students Against Destructive Decisions. Our High School Resource Officers Anthony Milito and Brian Eitner are very key participants in working with the township youth.
- Attended the Somerset County Business Partnership “Present and Future” presentation to hear updates from the State Chamber of Commerce, (Michael Egerton) County College (President McDonough), Somerset Hospital (Chief Operating Officer Deirdre Blaus), and County Administration (Sara Souie substituting for Colleen Mahr)
- Administrator Pappas, Police Chief Mitzak, and I had another walk-through of the vacant Ethicon building on Route 22.
- For the first time in several years we have had a measurable snowfall, meaning plowable. Our township snow plow drivers can’t decide to stay home or telecommute. They need to get on the road plowing over 200 miles of township roads. They did just that the other day. The downside of plowing our streets is that the snow has to go somewhere and that might mean it gets pushed across your driveway. That cannot be helped. If you live anywhere it snows that will happen. The public needs to understand that township employees cannot come back and dig out your driveway access.

Councilman Pedroso:

- Councilman Pedroso wished everyone a Happy Lunar New Year and added that it is an honor to have the Chinese Community’s banners hanging on the walls.

Council President Ring:

- Attended the Business Partnership State of NJ event regarding business climate. New Jersey’s tax rate is much higher than other states, such as Pennsylvania, which is in the process of substantially lowering its business taxes. President Ring stated that he hoped New Jersey can maintain a competitive advantage in this area.

- Attended an event at the mall this past Saturday to celebrate Chinese New Year, which marks the beginning of the lunar year. The event was well-attended, drawing in a US Congressman, a State Senator, and multiple State Assemblymen. Council President Ring congratulated the organizers for a job well done!
- Earlier today, Council President Ring attended a meeting of the Bridgewater Township Office of Emergency Management which hosted the Local Emergency Management Council Quarterly Meeting.

## Mayor's Reports

Michael Pappas, Township Administrator reported on behalf of Mayor Moench

- Congratulated Mr. Alex Jaszyn on joining the Police Department and wished him well.
- Distributed a memo from Richard Shimp, the Superintendent of Public Works, containing interesting statistics about the recent snow event.
- Township Administrator Pappas circulated a memo from Township Engineer, Bill Burr, along with photographs from the Tullo Road area that are in connection with the resolution on the agenda authorizing the County of Somerset to have an access easement.

## Swearing In

### OFFICER ALEX JASZYN

Police Chief John Mitzak welcomed everyone to the swearing-in of Officer Alex Jaszyn. He thanked Mayor Matthew Moench, Council President Timothy Ring, Council Vice President Howard Norgalis, Councilman Allen Kurdyla, Councilman Felipe Pedrosa, and Councilman Michael Kirsh for allowing the Police Department to swear in a new police officer to this department.

Chief Mitzak stated Officer Jaszyn is fully sworn police officer. Up until today, he worked as a patrolman for the town of Clinton for the past 1.5 years. He currently resides in Whitehouse Station, NJ. He attended Raritan Valley Community College and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from Stockton University. Officer Jaszyn made the dean's list for all semesters at Raritan Valley and Stockton University.

Prior to becoming a police officer, he was a lifeguard for the NJ Division of Parks and Forestry. For fun, Alex is an outdoorsman, he likes to fish, snowboard, and ride motorcycles. Alex earned his Eagle Scout when he was younger. During his interview with the command staff, Alex related that he wanted to come to Bridgewater Police Department to get involved in more aspects of police work and have more opportunities.

Police Chief Mitzak gave the following commentary: “Alex, thank you for becoming part of the Bridgewater PD Family. Your goals while working here are to do your best every day for the Bridgewater Community and your fellow officers and to go home to your loved ones every night.”

Officer Jaszyn, along with his father, Richard, Mother, Linda, and his Fiancé, Laura, were present for the swearing in. Officer Alex Jaszyn was Sworn in by Council President Ring.

Council President Ring read the following proclamation:

**WHEREAS**, the Bridgewater Chinese American Association has played a significant role in organizing events and activities that celebrate the Chinese Lunar New Year, allowing residents to come together in festive observance; and

**WHEREAS**, the contributions of the Bridgewater Chinese American Association have had a positive impact on promoting cultural awareness, building bridges of understanding, and fostering a sense of community pride; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chinese Lunar New Year celebrates the transition into a new Zodiac sign, and this year, 2024, ushers in the Year of the Dragon;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that I, Matthew C. Moench, Mayor of the Township of Bridgewater, do hereby proclaim 2024 as the Year of the Dragon in accordance with the Chinese Lunar New Year in our Township.

Council commended the Bridgewater Chinese American Association for their dedication to preserving and sharing the traditions of the Chinese Lunar New Year. Council also appreciated their efforts in promoting cultural understanding

Ms. Gallagher expressed concern with the proposed Weight Limit restrictions Ordinance and how it will affect commuters as well as residents. She mentioned that the project seems quite extensive and complex and that the area in question is a high accident zone.

Township Engineer William Burr IV, P.E stated that this is a preliminary concept. Additionally, they are now in a public information forum where they are soliciting feedback on their proposed plans.

any obstacles. The Township is currently identifying the specific parcels needed to traverse through, including County property, the possibility of Green Acres property, wetlands, and an existing detention basin. The Township has started identifying the next steps and will be ready to present their findings soon.

President Ring stated that the township is in year four (4) of a five (5) year commitment to improve the poor conditions of township roads. He expressed that substantial progress has been made over the past three (3) years, with over 200 roads completed. When the improvements have been finished, the township should only need to perform standard maintenance of the roads.

Councilman Pedroso opined that although he supports the principles of the road plan, he doesn't agree that the governing body should approve an eight (8) million-dollar bond without knowing the state of the township's finances. However, he stated that if there was a budget by the time the ordinance is to be adopted, he is willing to re-evaluate.
